



#### **Challenges**


- Discrepancies in higher level policy (health policy, procedure, structure, readiness requirements)
- Market demand vs Market capability (EFMP limitations, BH, Specialty Care, Primary Care)
- Unit is categorized Level 3C for manning and hard to fill location for civilian personnel which can results in the lack of auth/assigned personnel and degrades clinical capability and risk to mission
- Division provider performance (low productivity equates to decreased budget (service line and civ pay)

#### **Urgent Care**

- If after duty hours or away from the local area, family members are authorized unlimited urgent care visits to a TRICARE prime network UCC without a referral
- Active Duty service members MUST HAVE a referral to visit an Urgent Care Clinic, otherwise they will receive a bill for the services
  - Must call the 24/7 Nurse Advice Line at 800-TRICARE (874-2273) to request a referral
  - Follow-up with your primary care manager (PCM) after any UCC visit

#### **Emergency Care (Life, Limb, or Eyesight)**

- Go to the nearest Emergency Room (ER)
- No referral or authorization required
- Call an ambulance if needed
- Follow up with your PCM
- Notify PCM within 24-72 hours after your ER visit

### **Fort Drum OBGYN Services**

- Dating/Viability obstetric ultrasound
- Outpatient OB care up to a safe point before handing off to the community
- Follow-up miscarriage care
- Routine and preventative GYN services
- Complicated GYN referrals
- Major and minor GYN surgeries/procedures (completed at Samaritan Medical Center)
- RN triage calls during duty-hours
- Outpatient Antepartum Fetal Monitoring
- After 7 April, deliveries and after-hour OB triage will be performed by area hospitals

- PCC will soon introduce a checkout process at the end of patient visits, which will enable patients to
  efficiently schedule future appointments with the receptionist

# EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM

### What is the Exceptional Family Member Program?

The Exceptional Family Member Program is a mandatory enrollment program governed by AR 608-75 and DoDI 1315.19, June 23, 2023. This program works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated medical, educational, housing, community support, and personnel services to any Service Member with an Exceptional Family Member.

#### **Medical EFMP office has 3 main functions:**

- DA Nominative Review and recommendation
- Enrollment processing ( new enrollment, update to an enrollment or disenrollment)
- Family Member Travel Screening for all OCONUS assignments
- The Fort Drum office services all military branches (Army, Air Force, Marines, Navy, Space Force and National Guard) for all of New York state except NYC, Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and Canada

#### **Things to Know about EFMP:**

- NEW EFMP SITE: https://efmp.army.mil/EnterpriseEfmp/
- All Family Members over the age of 18 must have their own DS Logon
- Reminders to start the over seas screening process as soon as possible
  - Commanders need to let SM go to LEVY brief ASAP due to time constraints Spouse can take over after LEVY Brief
- Enrollments must be updated every 3 years
- The EFMP office at the Soldier and Family Service Center offers many community support activities, system navigators, and respite care

#### What are our challenges in meeting access to care?

- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) therapy
- Pediatric mental health care
- Distance and wait times for pediatric specialty providers
- Inpatient mental health care for both adult and pediatric patients
- Limited skilled nursing care and respite care capabilities

# **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)**

#### **Decision methodology:** Capability and Capacity

- Weekly care must be available within a 40-mile radius
- Monthly care within a 60-mile radius
- Quarterly care within a 90-mile radius
- Annual care within 100-miles (or farther)

#### Methods used to determine/validate:

- Humana Military website for network providers
- Spot checks (calls to specialty offices) to verify wait times for new patient appointments
- Discussions with MEDDAC providers
- Feedback from patients
- Coordination with our referral management office



#### What is Tricare Prime?

**TRICARE** is the uniformed services' health care program, with a worldwide network of military hospitals, clinics, and civilian health care providers

**TRICARE Prime** is a managed care option for active-duty service members (ADSMs) and their families, retired service members and their families (aside from those eligible for Medicare based on age), and other beneficiary categories (see website for details)

- ADSMs MUST enroll in TRICARE Prime
- Beneficiaries receive most care from their assigned PCM at the MTF
- PCMs refer beneficiaries to specialists for care as needed
- ADSMs pay nothing out-of-pocket

#### What is the USFHP?

The **USFHP** (Martin's Point) is a TRICARE Prime option available through networks of community-based, not-for-profit health care systems in six areas of the United States

Enrollment is open to active-duty family members, retired service members and their families, and other beneficiary categories (see website for details)

- Active-Duty service members CANNOT enroll in USFHP
- All care is provided by a designated USFHP primary care physician or specialist
- Beneficiaries CANNOT access care from military hospitals and clinics or from TRICARE-authorized providers




Provide the requested information by responding directly to the text messages you receive. When complete, your request will automatically be sent to the pharmacy for processing. In most cases, your medication will be ready for pick-up after 2 duty days at the Guthrie pharmacy during normal business hours.

## How do I request refills and renewals?

Refill requests must be called in to our automated refill line, 1-800-354-9280. Most requests will be ready in 2 business days.

Renewals can be requested via the MHS GENESIS Patient Portal, https://patientportal.mhsgenesis.health.mil/



#### My provider sent my prescription in days ago. Why was it not ready when I arrived at the pharmacy?

• Our pharmacies use a "fill on request" workflow, which means we do not prepare your medications until you request them.

#### What is the difference between a "refill" and a "renewal"?

When you receive a prescription, it may include several "refills." These allow you to fill that one prescription
multiple times without needing to ask for a new prescription. Eventually it will run out of refills, though.
When that happens you can request a "renewal," which is a completely new prescription, even if it has the
exact same directions as your previous prescription. As a new prescription, it might also include several
"refills."


#### What is Prior Authorization?

Some medications have rules that must be followed before your insurance company will cover them.
Usually, these rules ensure your prescriber has exhausted more cost-efficient options before trying more
expensive medications, which helps keep costs low for everybody. When your prescriber submits proof they
have followed the rules to your insurance company, they "authorize" you to receive these medications
"prior" to picking them up from the pharmacy.

# PATIENT ADVOCATE

#### What is JOES?

- Defense Health Agency assessment tool and confidential patient satisfaction survey
- Standardized sampling and universal means of delivery:
  - Via email, mail, and text (JOES-T)
- Provides insight for leadership on the beneficiary experience.
- JOES focuses primarily on the following:
  - · Access to care
  - Doctor or provider communication and courtesy
  - · Effectiveness of the clerks/receptionists
  - Overall satisfaction with the provider and healthcare
- JOES provides information to improve the level of service we provide
- Beneficiaries are surveyed only once within a 90-day period
- Completed satisfied JOES Surveys helps to improve customer experience


#### **Smooth Transition with School Aged Children**

- Withdraw your child; enroll upon arrival (if SY isn't completed).
- Hand carry school registration documents; unofficial copy of school records, IEP and 504 Plan.


