AFAP ISSUES (UPDATES)

Issue 6 - Running trails are falling apart

Scope: Makes it hard to share trails with the other units

Recommendation: Refurbish the trails

Issue Status: The improved trails and foot trails are cleared once a year. The drainage system does need work by LeRay Drive. It is not clear by the submission which trails are being referenced.



AFAP ISSUES (UPDATES)

Directorate of Public Works

Issue 5 - Mud and gravel around the buildings (CPAC) on South Post.

Scope: Hinders access for people in general and those with disabilities, tracks gravel and mud into facilities. **Recommendation:** Pave the driveways and areas around and up to the doors

Issue Status: The buildings in the 400 area can be relocated. It is planned that these offices will be moved to the old hotel once the new motel is opened. To pave this area is approximately a \$400 million dollar project.



AFAP ISSUES (UPDATES)

Issue 7 - Traffic Lights, Road Conditions

Scope: Traffic lights are taking too long to change. Traffic Lights on Mt. Belvedere and Iraqi Freedom are to close in timing (2 submissions), Soldiers are doing PT and people are running red lights. There are near misses every day and the roads are full of pot holes

Recommendation: The traffic lights should be re-timed and fixing of the roads should be done. Recommend that the major intersections have signs added. There are no signs to indicate where the gates are. There is no transition light at Enduring Freedom and Conway Road. Higher MP presence during PT hours at the Mt. Belvedere and Iraqi Freedom

Issue Status: Six road construction projects are being started, beginning at Gasoline Alley. The signals are designed and timed for peak hours. An ongoing study continues to know where to adjust the signals.

- ✓ Will be implemented by 1 November 2017. Impacted patrons were notified on 30 September 2017.
- ✓ Patrons who are receiving current benefits will be grandfathered through the end of their deployment cycle.
 - ❖ For Surviving Families, benefits will change at time of re-registration.

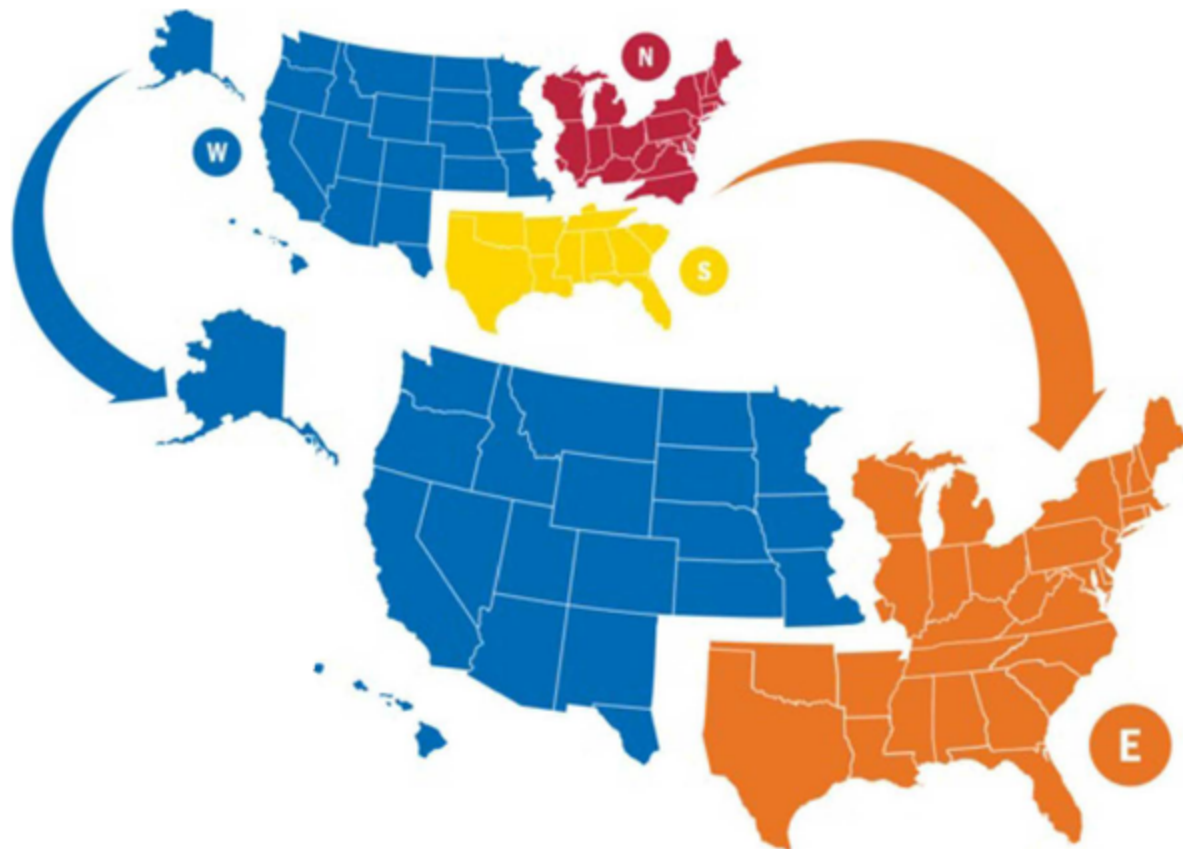

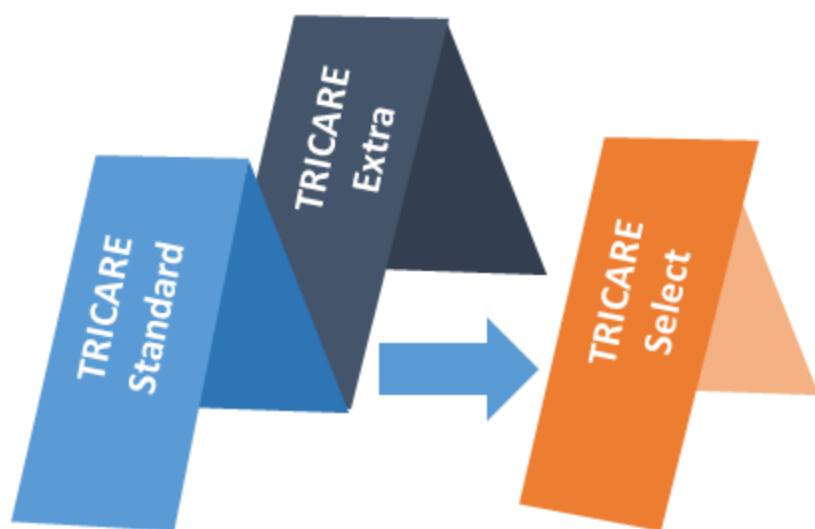

Moving to TRICARE Select

#takecommand

On Jan. 1, 2018, existing TRICARE Standard beneficiaries will be auto-enrolled in TRICARE Select.

- Preferred provider organization (PPO) style plan
- Replaces TRICARE Standard and TRICARE Extra
- New active duty family members will be auto-enrolled in TRICARE Select if they live outside of a Prime Service Area or overseas
- Changing to TRICARE Select will mean no decrease in coverage



Enrollment Changes

#takecommand



- Administration of the TRICARE benefit will transition from a Fiscal Year period (Oct. – Sept.) to a Calendar Year period (Jan. – Dec.)
- There will be a transition period from Oct. 1, 2017 to Dec. 31, 2017.
 - Enrollment fees will be prorated for the three-month period (Oct. 1 – Dec. 31, 2017) and billed accordingly for beneficiaries who pay on a monthly or quarterly basis.
 - Beneficiaries who pay fees on an annual basis will have their payments credited toward the transition period and any future enrollment fees.
- TRICARE Prime beneficiaries will need to pay an additional quarter's premium to cover Oct. 1, 2017 – Dec. 31, 2017. Then actual renewal will be on Jan. 1, 2018.

Enrollment Freeze

#takecommand



- By **Nov. 20, 2017** beneficiaries should complete any and all enrollment actions.
- During **December 2017**, there will be an enrollment freeze for TRICARE Prime enrollments, and primary care manager changes will be delayed.
- You will still be able to receive care during the enrollment freeze.
- Eligible beneficiaries must be registered in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System, or DEERS, to enroll in TRICARE Prime or a Prime option online, by phone or by mail.

Health Plan Costs for 2018

- Starting Jan. 1, 2018, costs for TRICARE benefits will be charged by Calendar Year (Jan. – Dec.) instead of Fiscal Year (Oct. – Sept.).
- You will fall into two groups based on when you or your sponsor entered active duty.
- Each group will have different enrollment fees and out-of-pocket costs.
 - **Group A:** If you or your sponsor's initial enlistment or appointment occurred before Jan. 1, 2018, you are in Group A.
 - **Group B:** If you or your sponsor's initial enlistment or appointment occurs on or after Jan. 1, 2018, you are in Group B.

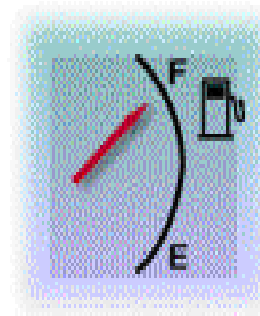

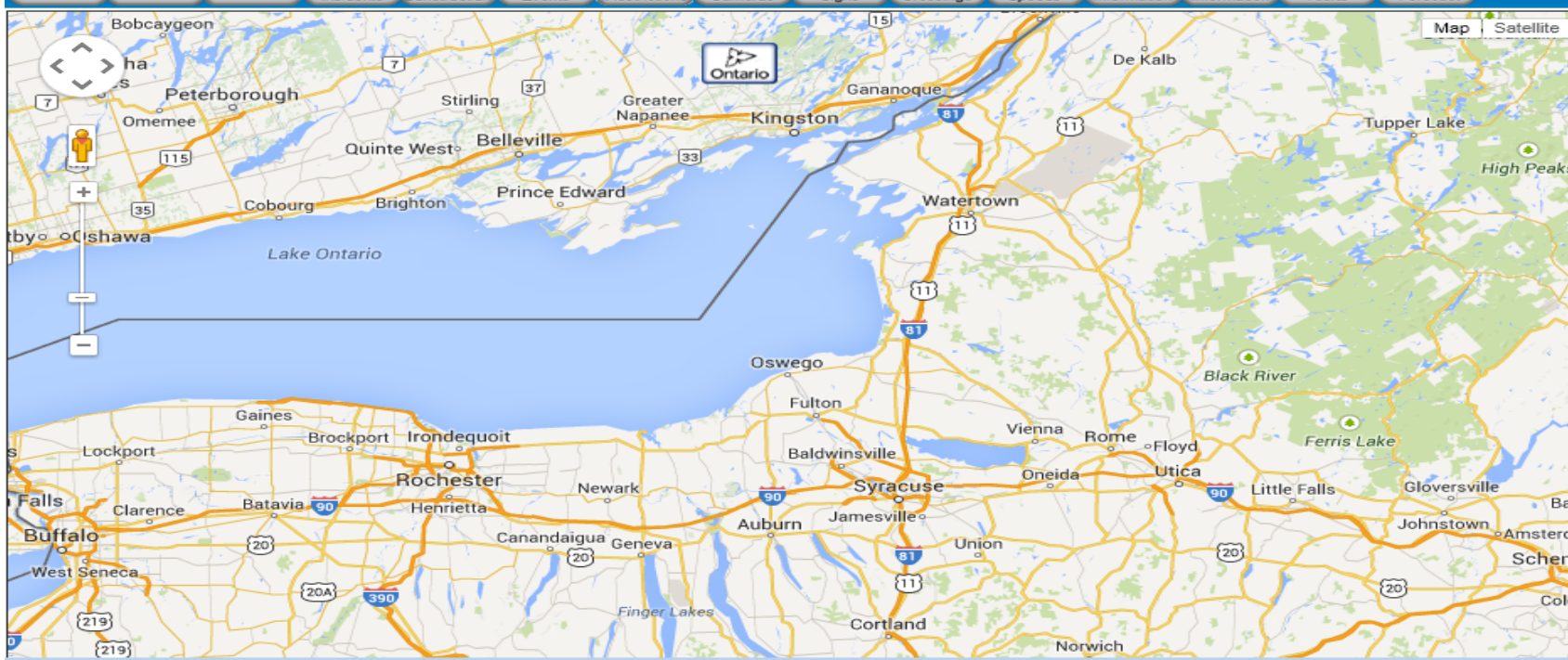

Zero Alcohol Keeps You Safe on the Trail

Drinking alcohol before snowmobiling or during your ride slows your reactions, impairs your judgment, and is a leading contributor to snowmobiling deaths.

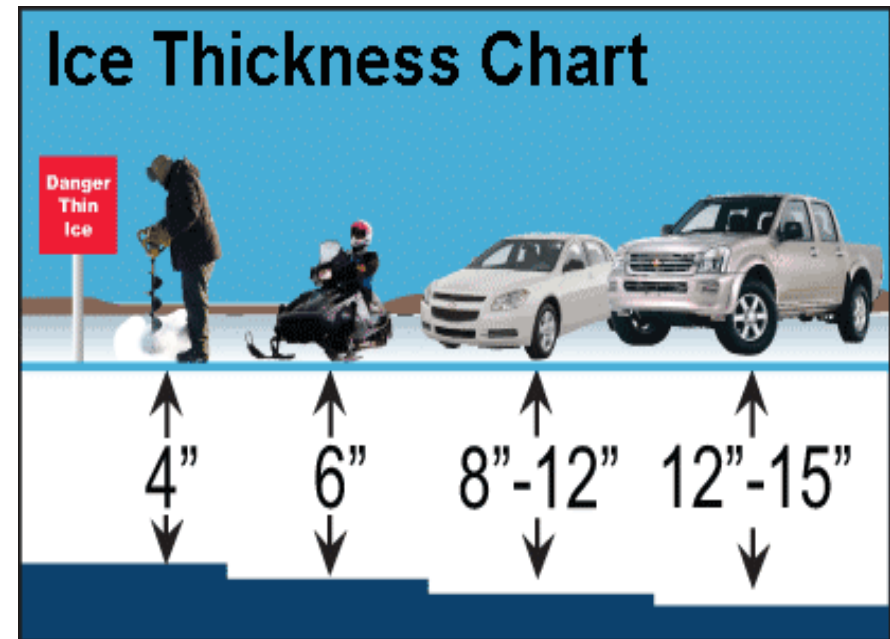
3" or less Stay off the ice.
