### **Fire Prevention**

Hoarding is a condition where a person has persistent difficulty discarding personal possessions. The large amount of possessions fill the home and prevent the normal use of the space. Living space becomes cluttered. It may be unusable. Hoarding brings distress and emotional health concerns

# Why Hoarding Increases Fire Risks

- Cooking is unsafe if flammable items are close to the stove or oven.
- Heating units may be too close to things that can burn. They might also be placed on unstable surfaces. If a heater tips over into a pile, it can cause a fire.
- Electrical wiring may be old or worn from the weight of piles. Pests could chew on wires. Damaged wires can start fires.
- Open flames from smoking materials or candles in a home with excess clutter are very dangerous.
- Blocked pathways and exits may hinder escape from a fire.

### **How Hoarding Impacts First Responders**

- Hoarding puts first responders in harm's way.
- Firefighters cannot move swiftly through a home filled with clutter.
- Responders can be trapped in a home when exits are blocked. They can be injured by objects falling from piles.
- The weight of the stored items, especially if water is added to put out a fire, can lead to building collapse.
- Fighting fires is very risky in a hoarding home. It is hard to enter the home to provide medical care. The clutter impedes the search and rescue of people and pets.

- Active Shooter Response Application: Army Training and Doctrine Command developed an active shooter response mobile application for the Army. The application is free to download from Google Play, iTunes and other online stores. This application has the necessary and vital information that will save lives, time, and educate those with little to no training on active shooter response situations. Users are able to simply tap to open the app and tap another button to reach the emergency dialer. Also included in the app is an Active Shooter Preparedness Video, How to Respond When Law Enforcement Arrives, Leadership Responsibilities, Profile of an Active Shooter, and other reference material.
- EMERGENCY CONTACT NUMBERS: dial 911 from any land-line. That call will go
  directly to the DES Dispatch Center. If you dial 911 from your cell phone, that call
  will go directly to the Jefferson County Dispatch Center; advise the dispatcher you
  are calling from Fort Drum and they will redirect your call to the DES dispatch
  center. Current technology does not allow for the separation of cell phone calls
  on or off the installation.

• APPROVED ADEQUATE RENTAL HOUSING: The Army Housing Online Users Services (AHOUS) at <a href="www.housing.army.mil">www.housing.army.mil</a> is the Army's one-stop site for all housing information, on and off-post, at any Army installation. This website contains information and links for information on barracks, on-post family housing and off-post housing. Current listings, updated weekly, of available off-post rentals at approved apartment complexes are available at the Welcome Home Center. The overall rental housing market vacancy rate is about 5 %. Further from post has greater vacancies and typically lower rents, while closer to post and newer rentals typically have fewer vacancies and slightly higher rents. However, all rents are generally within the BAH rates and therefore affordable. There's plenty of choices available for most categories of rental housing with competitive rates. On-post Family Housing and the Timbers has some availability and a few at (lower than BAH) market rates. Coordinate early for on-post housing to ensure you get the right home for your Family with minimal delays. Check with Fort Drum's Welcome Home Center at Clark Hall (2<sup>nd</sup> floor of Clark Hall) for the latest information (315-955-6644).

Never enter into a lease without checking first with the Army Community Housing Office to see if the rental you are contemplating has been inspected by us for basic safety and habitability criteria. Always get your lease reviewed by Legal Assistance or the Army Community Housing Office prior to signing to be sure all your rights are safeguarded and you're not entering into a situation that could turn bad for you after you move in. It looks like winter is finally coming to an end in most parts of the country. If the warmer weather means you'll be getting outside to clear winter debris, and get your home ready for spring, make sure you do it safely.

- Make sure equipment is working properly with all machine guards in place and secure. Wear safety goggles, sturdy
  shoes, and long pants when using lawn mowers and other machinery. Wear gloves to protect from skin irritations,
  cuts, and contaminants.
- Follow instructions and warning labels on chemical and lawn and garden equipment.
- Protect your hearing when operating machinery. If you have to raise your voice to talk to someone who is an arm's length away, the noise can be potentially harmful to your hearing.
- Use insect repellant containing DEET. Wear light clothes and tuck pants into boots to prevent exposure to ticks.
   Inspect clothing and skin after yard work and remove ticks safely. Reduce the risk of sunburn and skin cancer by wearing long sleeves, a wide-brimmed hat, and sunshades. Use sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher.
- Keep an eye on the thermometer and take precautions in the heat. When working in hot weather, remember to drink plenty of liquids, but not those that contain alcohol or large amounts of sugar, as they can cause you to lose body fluid. Pay attention to signs of heat-related illness, including high body temperature, headache, dizziness, rapid pulse, nausea, confusion, or unconsciousness.
