Access Control

REAL ID Update:

- The following states/territories are complaint: Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, DC, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Nebraska, New York, New Mexico, Nevada, North Carolina, Ohio, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming. Currently all of the remaining states have been extended to **10 October 2018** The attached link will provide the most current information in reference to compliance: https://www.dhs.gov/real-id

• Trusted Traveler Program (TTP)

- a. TTP will only be used during FPCONs NORMAL, ALPHA, and BRAVO, and may be withdrawn by approving authority when security considerations dictate. TTP allows personnel access to the installation without undergoing an NCIC-III check and being issued a pass, it does not eliminate the requirement to provide identification.
- b. TTP allows the following personnel to vouch for occupants in their immediate vehicle, provided the Trusted Traveler vehicle operator possesses a valid identification card:
- (1) Uniformed services members and adult family members (age 18 and over), including retirees, in physical possession of DoD ID Card.
 - (2) Military retirees in possession of DD Form 2A and their spouses in possession of DD Form 1173.
 - (3) DoD Civilian employees in possession of a CAC card.
- c. TTP is not authorized for persons under the age of 18 or persons not in possession of a valid ID identified above, volunteers, family care providers, or contractors with a DoD CAC card.
- d. All personnel, 18 and over, will be required to produce a photo ID for physical inspection and scanning, as requested by guard force personnel.
- e. Personnel with a Local Access Badge are not authorized to participate in TTP.
- f. TTP procedures are only valid for Fort Drum and not recognized by other installations.
- g. The number of personnel a trusted traveler is allowed to vouch for is limited to those personnel physically in their vehicle.
- h. Trusted travelers are responsible for the actions of their guests and for meeting all security requirements for entering Fort Drum.

Fire Prevention. Grilling Safety:

There is nothing like outdoor grilling. It is one of the most popular ways to cook food, but a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

Fort Drum access passes are available on-line for free. New York State licenses are also required for hunting and fishing. Trout season began April 1 and trout stocking occurred April 24. Northern pike and walleye season begins May 5; bass season begins June 16. Turkey hunting season began in the Northern Zone (including Fort Drum) on May 1 and runs through the entire month. apartment complexes are available at the Welcome Home Center. The overall rental housing market vacancy rate is just under 5 %. Further from post has greater vacancies and typically lower rents, while closer to post and newer rentals typically have fewer vacancies and slightly higher rents. However, all rents are generally within the BAH rates and therefore affordable.
