Home Based Businesses (HBBs)

- Prior to submitting a packet for a HBB, you are welcome to contact the Fort Drum Exchange Services Business
 Manager (SBM), Elona Sciotti, at (315)773-5633, Sciotti@aafes.com. The SBM can review your plan, provide feedback
 to assist you with your submission packet, or advise of obstacles that may impede your approval.
- HBB Solicitation Packets can be picked up at the FMWR Financial Readiness Office.
- FMWR Financial will provide you contact information to schedule appointments with one or more of the following businesses. Complete review of your packet and required signatures/input: MWR, DECA, Housing, and/or The Army & Air Force Exchange Service
- After review of Completed packet with signatures, return packet to FMWR Financial Readiness for preparation and submission to the Garrison Command.
- Garrison Commander provides final decision on all HBB Commercial Solicitations.

Exchange Concession Opportunities

- The Exchange seeks short term commodities that are cash and carry. Businesses that are strictly order only, such as AVON, can only operate at the Exchange if they have inventory that they can sell under the "Cash and Carry" terms.
- The Exchange negotiates all fees with each concession separately based on annual sales, type of commodity, location in the mall, as well as other factors. Concessions are not authorized to discuss their fee % as they are not all the same and this can cause animosity within the hall. We seek to agree to a fair fee where the concession can make a decent income while still contributing to the Exchange and in turn the Exchange contributes back to MWR.
- Other than cottage food, food business operations are not authorized in private housing, as per the Tri-Service Food Code. Any exceptions, if deemed authorized by legal, will require GC approval.



ADPAAS What Is It?



The Army Disaster Personnel Accountability and Assessment System (ADPASS) is the Army's way of accounting for personnel and Families after catastrophes. It is a **web-based**, user-friendly system that enables the Army to collect accurate and timely reports in times of emergency. All Soldiers, DA Civilians, Family members and overseas defense contractors must report their status and whereabouts following any natural or man-made disaster, if directed to do so by the Secretary of Defense or their Major Commands.



ADPAAS Development



DOD mandated that each of the services procure an automated accountability system after difficulties accounting for personnel during Hurricanes Katrina and Rita during the 2005 Atlantic hurricane season. To comply, the Army established ADPAAS in 2008 and it is populated with personnel information from both the Active and Reserve components. ADPAAS was first put to use after Hurricane Ike in September 2008 and successfully accounted for over 24,000 people. It has also been tested through exercises, including several Army Headquarters and National Level Exercises. Since 2008, ADPAAS has been used to account for Army personnel after numerous real-world disasters.



Why ADPASS Is Important To You




ADPAAS is the only way the Army will accept status reports from Soldiers, DoD Civilians, Families and overseas defense contractors following a disaster. It enables commanders to identify and account for those in their command that have been affected by a disaster through consolidation of reports submitted by Soldiers, DoD Civilians, Family members and overseas defense contractors via the Internet and phone. In addition, ADPAAS allows sponsors and Family members affected by a catastrophe to request assistance via a Needs Assessment Survey, which in turn helps leaders prioritize the type and quantity of resources and assistance where needed.



ADPASS Log In Page



COR Management



- ADPAAS is managed by Commanders Representatives or CORs.
- Each COR is responsible for one or more Unit Identification Codes (UICs).
- CORs can only see personnel and Family members assigned to their UIC.
- When an ADPAAS event is activated the COR pulls a spreadsheet from the ADPAAS web site and provides the list of names to their units/directorates for accountability.
- The COR is responsible for reporting personnel accountability status to the Commander on a daily basis until the event is closed out.
