• The Visitor Control Center (VCC) is now open 7 days a week from 0530-2200. All visitors are required to obtain their passes there prior to going to the gates. Personnel arriving when VCC is closed require a sponsor present at Cerjan ACP to be processed unless sponsorship application has been submitted in advance and the passes are present at the gate.

• With the holidays approaching and plans being formalized for family and friends visiting please make sure that all requests for passes are submitted in advance so they can be processed and passes ready for them when they arrive. Requests should be submitted 72 hours prior to arrival to ensure completion.

• Sponsorship applications available at: <u>https://home.army.mil/drum/index.php/about/visitor-information</u>. Use IMDR-ES Form 2 for sponsored passes and IMDR-ES Form 3 for the one day, unsponsored, pass. **The address to submit these applications in advance:** <u>usarmy.drum.imcom.mbx.des-acp@mail.mil</u>.

- Personnel wishing to visit Fort Drum for business or leisure may do so providing they present a valid form of identification and receive a favorable NCIC-III check. A Day Access Pass (valid from 0730-2300) will be issued to visitors upon authentication. Reoccurring visits that extend over multiple days require the individual to receive sponsorship and multi-day passes.
- Winter is approaching so please take necessary precautions when approaching the gates. Reduce speed while approaching the guards. Ensure that your vehicle registration and inspection stickers are visible for the guard to see. Also ensure that all snow is removed from the top of vehicles to prevent unnecessary incidents/violations.

  - o Christmas Trees
    - Use a commercial non-combustible tree
    - Live trees should be fresh, green, and regularly watered
    - Use quality UL listed lights (LEDs are the safest)
  - Candles
    - Use with caution!
    - Place them on a non-combustible surface
    - Keep them away from combustibles
    - NEVER leave candles unattended
    - Keep away from children and pets

- Winter Weather:
  - Ensure heating equipment is in proper working order
  - Select and use portable heaters with care
  - Keep <u>all</u> emergency exits clear of snow and ice

## Winter Parking:

- Winter is upon us as are winter parking regulations. There is no parking on the sides of roadways on Fort Drum from November 1<sup>st</sup> until April 1<sup>st</sup> and vehicles which are found to be in violation may be ticketed and may be towed at the owner's expense if impeding snow removal.
- Law Enforcement will conduct a robust messaging campaign in the early winter months. Vehicles may also not be parked across sidewalks or on seeded areas near housing.
- Exceptions to policy for special events (holiday parties etc.) may be requested not less than 14 days in advance through DES Operations (CPT Morgan Cady, morgan.p.cady.civ@mail.mil or CPT Don Manfredi Donald.t.manfredi.civ@mail.mil)

Winter Driving: Winter weather has historically contributed to accidents on Fort Drum New York

- When required to operate a motor vehicle during winter weather conditions ensure you maintain a safe speed. Several
  incidents occur due to motor vehicle operators driving too fast for conditions often resulting in the vehicle leaving the
  roadway.
- During the winter, many accidents occur in parking lots due to decreased space and slick conditions created by ice and snow. Stay alert, reduce speed, and use caution when traveling in/through parking lots to prevent unnecessary accidents.

Sobriety: Don't Drink and Drive – Law Enforcement has increased sobriety checks during holiday months, both off and on post.

## Safety Compliance Checkpoints:

- Fort Drum New York will continue Safety Compliance Checkpoints.
- Safety Compliance checkpoints will be conducted in the outbound lane of the access control points and will focus on
  educating FDNY Soldiers, civilians, and family members on laws and regulations regarding safely operating a motor vehicle
  in the state of NY.
- Use caution when approaching established checkpoints and follow the direction of law enforcement personnel to ensure the safety of our Law Enforcement personnel.

• BASIC ALLOWANCE FOR HOUSING (BAH): New BAH rates go into effect each calendar year on 1 January. Those Soldiers who were already signed in at Fort Drum and receiving the previous year's rate, will keep the same rate if higher than the new rate or receive the new rate if higher than the previous year's rate for their pay grade. This website contains information and links for information on barracks, on-post family housing and off-post housing. Current listings, updated weekly, of available off-post rentals at approved apartment complexes are available at the Welcome Home Center in Clark Hall. The overall rental housing market vacancy rate is about 10%; further from post has greater vacancies and typically lower rents, while closer to post and newer rentals typically have fewer vacancies and slightly higher rents. ### • Carbon Monoxide: The Invisible Killer

More than 400 Americans die from unintentional carbon monoxide poisoning every year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. More than 20,000 visit the emergency room, and more than 4,000 others are hospitalized.

### <u>Where Does Carbon Monoxide Come From?</u>

Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that often goes undetected, striking victims caught off guard or in their sleep. This "silent killer" is produced by burning fuel in cars or trucks, small engines, stoves, lanterns, grills, fireplaces, gas ranges, portable generators or furnaces. When the gas builds up in enclosed spaces, people or animals who breathe it can be poisoned. Ventilation does not guarantee safety. The Consumer Product Safety Commission says about 170 people in the United States die every year from carbon monoxide produced by non-automotive consumer products, such as room heaters. So as the weather turns colder, it's important to take extra precautions.

### • Who is at Risk?

Exposure to carbon monoxide can result in permanent neurological damage or death, and anyone can be at risk. The CDC says infants, the elderly, and people with chronic heart disease, anemia or breathing problems are more prone to illness or death, but carbon monoxide doesn't discriminate - especially if certain conditions are present.

## • How Can I Prevent Carbon Monoxide Poisoning in My Home?

The National Safety Council recommends you install a battery-operated carbon monoxide detector in your home near the bedrooms. Check or replace the battery when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall. The CDC offers these additional tips:

• Have your heating system, water heater and any other gas or coal-burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year

• Do not use portable flameless chemical heaters indoors

• Never use a generator inside your home, basement or garage or less than 20 feet from any window, door or vent; fatal levels of carbon monoxide can be produced in just minutes

• Have your chimney checked and cleaned every year, and make sure your fireplace damper is open before lighting a fire and well after the fire is extinguished

- Make sure your gas appliances are vented properly
- Never use a gas oven for heating your home
- Never let a car idle in the garage
- Know the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning

## • <u>Steps to Take When Carbon Monoxide Alarm Sounds The CPSC says never ignore a carbon monoxide alarm, and do not try to</u> <u>find the source of the gas. Instead, follow these steps:</u>

- Immediately move outside to fresh air
- Call emergency services, fire department or 911
- Do a head count to check that all persons are accounted for
- Do not reenter the premises until emergency responders have given you permission to do so
- Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning
  - Low to moderate carbon monoxide poisoning is characterized by:
  - Headache
  - Fatigue
  - Shortness of breath
  - Nausea
  - Dizziness
- High level carbon monoxide poisoning results in:
  - Mental confusion
  - Vomiting
  - Loss of muscular coordination
  - Loss of consciousness
  - Death
